Open your PowerPoint poster presentation and make sure you can see the slides in the side pane.

BACKGROUND


- Core mission of APSA is to promote the safe delivery of surgical care for children
- In 2016 the FDA released a communication cautioning parents regarding negative impacts of anesthesia in children younger than 2 years old
- Given the broad impact this would have on the greater APSA membership we sought to survey the group about their opinions on the communication
- Total of 299 response with respondents agreed that the national discussion on
- Greater than 90% of responders at some point before the data is inadequate (58% viewed the communication
- Only 15% of responders believe no deleterious effects (25% believing it is detrimental

METHODS

- A twelve question survey was put together and distributed to the APSA membership with results collected via SurveyMonkey®.

Step 2

From here, select all of the slides, except the first one (you can follow these steps for each slide, one at a time, if you do not know how to do this). When the slides are selected, right-click on them, and select the option that says “Hide Slides” from the resulting contextual menu. It should already have a check mark next to it



Step 3

You can then right-click again on the slides to make sure that “Hide Slide” is now unchecked. Don't select it again, this is how you want it to be for this export (unchecked)

- A twelve question survey was put together and distributed to the APSA membership with results collected via SurveyMonkey®.

RESULTS

- Total of 299 responses with 290 complete surveys. More than 95% respondents agreed that APSA should have a greater representation on the national discussion on surgical and anesthetic safety
- Greater than 90% of respondents discuss the FDA communication patients at some point before elective surgery, but majority (92%) the data is inadequate (89%) or are unsure of it (34%). Half of the respondents viewed the communication neutrally and 35% viewed it negatively
- Only 15% of respondents believe anesthetic exposure in small children has no deleterious effects on neurocognition → 90% being one, 25% believing it is detrimental

- We believe this survey highlights the need for further engagement of APSA in the discussion of neurocognitive effects of anesthetics.



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
Step 4

Once you have verified that it is unchecked, you can go to the File menu and select Export, exactly as you did when you first created the narrated movie files for this presentation



Step 5

In the resulting Export menu that comes up, make sure that PDF is selected as the export option. It should be the default:



Click Export.

After you have verified that the PDF looks the way you want it to (please check it), you can upload it to the same Dropbox folder that you uploaded your poster .mp4 file to.

Please make sure the PDF is titled exactly as your .mp4 file was (P[number] Name), e.g. **P31SMITH**.
